R COLORS OF ROME


Colors of Rome covers 5 thematic sections, organized chronologically: the art of mosaics among Romans; living in Rome during the end of the Republican age; the Hilarian basilica; mosaics from the necropolis of Rome and lastly 16 newly restored marble mosaics from late Antiquity period, illustrating the pinnacle of luxury in ancient Rome. The exhibition covers mosaics in domestic, religious, and funerary settings, wrapping up with a display of the most ambitious and luxurious executions of mosaic art featuring colored marble and precious mineral mosaics. The broad spectrum of cultural spaces these mosaics were found in, along with the many materials used to construct the pieces, provides an insight into artistic trends, techniques, and purposes of mosaics throughout their history. These aspects also display overarching motifs present in Roman society and how artists shaped these motifs for the unique taste of their patrons.

Colors of Rome is comprised of mosaic pieces using varying materials from polychrome to marble. They are from homes, temples, necropolises, and public spaces and show everything from floral motifs and folklore stories to depictions of mythological figures. *Colors of Rome* also includes masterfully carved marble statues, telling stories of important Roman figures through their looming beauty.










EXHIBITION INCLUDES
